This Months News from the Editor.

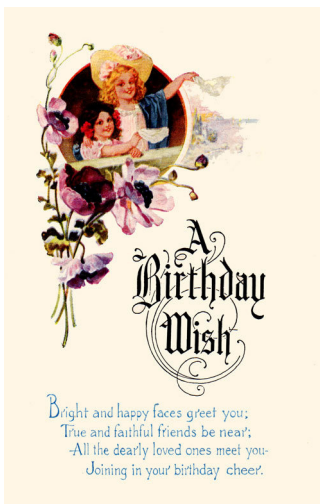
